This Issue's Feature- Interview with our National Junior handler winner and Clumber breeder(NewDayClumbers). Laurence Giguere.

This interview was done with the Canadian Dog Judges Association.

CDJA Interview

I am 18 years old and live in Quebec. I breed Clumber Spaniels with my parents. I am currently in my last year of college and will enter law school next year. I have been showing dogs since I was 7 and want to pursue this passion of mine when I am older even if I do not want to become a professional handler.

When did you first become involved in Jr. Handling?

I first became involved in junior handling when I saw a competition at the Club Canin Chomedey in 2012. I immediately told my mother that I wanted to try and the next day I was participating. I immediately fell in love with the sport and never stopped competing in junior handling until the day I aged out.

Was this your first trip to Crufts?

It was my first trip to the prestigious Crufts!

What were your first impressions upon arriving at Crufts?

My first impression upon arriving at Crufts was that this show is humongous! I have never been to a show where there are the same amount of spectators and exhibitors. It was very special to see how for many English residents this show is for them an event that they attend each year! I would love that our sport would be as popular here!

Please describe the judging procedure?

The judging procedure of the junior handling competition is similar to the one we have in Canada with some small differences. For example when we enter the ring we go across the ring one at a time and because the ring is way bigger than the one we have here there are person's telling us where to go. Each competitor presents their dog to the judge and completes a triangle. Then if we still had time the judge could make us do another pattern which for us was to do an up and down. In Canada, we need to keep our leach in our hands or neck the entire time it can not go on the floor but there it is not a requirement which was pretty shocking for me. It was a well-prepared competition as the day before we competed, we did a rehearsal to present us ring procedures.

What advice would you give a future Canadian Jr. handler who travels to Crufts?


The advice that I would give to a future Canadian junior handler participating at Crufts is to keep your calm and to act like it was a regular competition. Many people came to see me and asked if I was stressed, and I answered no and that for me it was just another experience that I wanted to enjoy every minute instead of stressing the entire time and



it shows while you are in the ring. At this point you are already a winner so enjoy this additional experience!

Laurence wanted to show a Clumber at Crufts however Clumbers were being shown at the same time as the junior competition.


E Eugene was whelped April 10, 2015, by Helen and Otto Marshall and sold as a pet to Mary Ann Karney.

A A lovely Irish lady in Pennsylvania. He joined two other Clumbers from Shogun Kennel. Unfortunately, Mary Ann died in December 2021 after a long battle with cancer. Family friends were able to adopt the two other boys but could not take Eugene.

Eugene was adopted by a lady in Maryland who meant well but had no experience with a rowdy sporting dog. She sent him to three trainers who turned out to be progressively abusive. When Mary Ann's friends discovered the situation, they came back and rescued him. They called Helen the breeder and she called me. I had just lost my young Clumber to a devastating disease and Helen said,

"he needs you as much as you need him". Eugene came home to me by Clumber Friends and Will Alexander. Eugene has become my funny face and a never-ending source of pleasure for me.

REMEMBERING DONALD WELLS



Don was a long-time member of the CSCC and long-time director for the Atlantic zone. He will be missed by many in the dog community. I personally, have Don and his clumber Curtiss to thank for our love of this amazing breed. I had been involved with purebred dogs since I was born. My parents had Dobermans and I had been attending dog shows since I was 6 months old back in 1981. My now husband Elliott, however, did not attend a dog show until we started dating. One of the dog shows I took Elliott with me to he quickly noticed a Clumber on a grooming table and off he went!!! Well, that Clumber was Curtiss and that kind man was Don Wells. Don was so very kind to Elliott and allowed him to meet Curtiss and get to know the breed. I will never forget the big smile on Elliotts face as he came back over to my mother and I standing there and he says, "We are getting a Clumber some day!". And the rest as they say is History. I will always be forever grateful to Don for taking the time that day with Elliott and allowing him to meet Curtiss.



Outside of dogs, Don had quite the achievements as well. He was a nuclear physicist in his professional life. His roles included Vice President of University of Manitoba, President and Vice-Chancellor of the University of Mount Allison, and President and Vice-Chancellor of University of Regina. In his retirement, and one of his proudest accomplishments was the creation of The Valley Hospice in Nova Scotia. You can read more about Don as well at the Link below:

Don's interest in Clumber Spaniels started with his daughter who lives in Scottsdale, Arizona. ShebredClumbersasahobby.

Chapter One: The first Clumber Donhadwas Pierre. Donwas in the process of training

Pierre to go to Nationals in Montreal where he would meet up with his daughter. Unfortunately, Pierre died suddenly, a ruptured Thymus Gland it was believed to be. Needless to say both Don and his daughter were very upset. A funny story about Pierre as I recall Don telling - he ate an entire pound of butter(Don was a baker). that was sitting on the counter.....you can only guess what happened.

Chapter Two: The second Clumber was Curtiss aka Ch. Cactus Kill Devil Hills. Don's

daughter was his breeder. Curtiss and Don went to many dog shows over the years and Curtiss won several awards. His last showing was in the veterans class in Halifax where the 2015 CSCC National was held. Both Curtiss and Don were seen as being happy together taking one more spin around the conformation ring! At this show, Curtiss and Don were able to meet up with a lady who used to show Curtiss as a Junior. It was touching to see this. Curtiss passed away at the age of 12 of natural causes.

Chapter Three: The third Clumber is Peyton. She is 8 years old. Again, this dog was sent to Don from his daughter in Arizona. Peyton was bred in Australia and was brought to the US to be bred but had some health issues which were not in line with breeding so instead she became a treasured pet. She weighs 50 pounds and Don said she is the calmest of all of his Clumbers. Peyton had the opportunity to spend time with Don during his final 2 weeks at Valley Hospice and it was such a comforting sight. While visiting Don, she brought a twinkle to other patients and family members eyes.



Don you will always be remembered by your Clumber Spaniel family for your contributions to the breed and our club.
